## Post-Breast Biopsy



- Apply icepack to the biopsy site: 30 minutes on 30 minutes off until bedtime on the day of the procedure.
- Tylenol every 4-6 hrs for pain as needed. NO aspirin/aspirin products (Motrin or Advil) for 5 days after the procedure.
- · Avoid strenuous activity for 24-48 hours.
- · Wear a sports bra after the procedure for support.
- May return to work the day after the procedure (unless otherwise directed).
- Remove dressing/bandage the next day. DO NOT remove the steri-strips (thin tape). These strips will fall off on their own. If they are still attached after 7 days you may remove them.
- Shower the next day avoiding excessive scrubbing to the biopsy site.

#### What to Expect:

- Bruising/discoloration of the biopsy site(s)
- Minimal oozing or droplets of blood on dressing, skin, and/or steri-strips
- · Mild pain, discomfort, fullness at the site

#### What If:

- If excessive bleeding occurs, apply firm constant pressure to the site for at least 20 minutes.
- · If bleeding cannot be stopped, see contact numbers below.
- If you are experiencing excessive pain, discharge, redness, swelling or warmth, see contact numbers below.

#### **Contact Numbers:**

- If you need assistance during normal business hours
  (8 a.m. to 5 p.m. M-F), call the office where the biopsy was performed
  and ask for the Biopsy Department or Biopsy Radiologist.
- If this is an emergency that cannot wait until normal business hours, call our 24/7 Call Center at 732-955-8877 and ask to speak with the Radiologist or Resident on-call.

### **Biopsy Results:**

- The radiologist will review the results and make recommendations based on the pathology which will then be communicated to the ordering provider.
- The ordering provider will inform you of the results and recommendations.
- If you do not receive your biopsy results, please contact your ordering provider.
- If you have not been notified of your results within 10 business days from the biopsy, please call the breast biopsy dept.

### **Glucose Monitoring Devices**

Devices such as the 'FreeStyle Libre' must be removed before any MRI, CT scan, PET/CT scan, Mammogram, DEXA, or X-ray. The exposure may damage the device and cause incorrect readings.

#### **Payment**
